SLOAN AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS

The Fund for the City of New York's Sloan Awards for Excellence in Teaching Science and Mathematics recognize seven outstanding Science and Mathematics teachers in New York City public high schools. The Award consists of \$5,000 to the teacher and \$2,500 to the teacher's department to support its program.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE:

To qualify, a teacher must have taught Science or Mathematics in New York City public high schools for a minimum of five years and be a full-time teacher, teaching at least four periods a day. Two of the seven awards are designated for teachers in high schools whose students are admitted via citywide competitive exams.

WHO CAN NOMINATE:

Fellow teachers, principals, assistant principals, parents, students and colleagues at institutions that partner with NYC high schools.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

Among the criteria to be used in the evaluation of the candidates are:

- Student achievement, progress and outcomes
- Teaching style and effectiveness
- Innovation and creativity in the classroom environment
- Extracurricular mathematics or science activities for students
- Success in motivating students with diverse or special backgrounds
- Use of technology ((where appropriate)
- Promotion of mathematics and science inside and outside the school
- Encouragement of students to pursue careers in science and mathematics
